Innovating in the Field of Medications and Pregnancy

CAMCCO-L is looking for candidates who wish to join our 2025-2026 curriculum cohort to further their transdisciplinary knowledge and become an expert in perinatal research on medications!

About CAMCCO-L

A bilingual (French and English) and free of charge web platform offering a virtual transdisciplinary training program in perinatal research on medications complementary to the university academic programs, which are based on individual discipline courses.

Online courses given live (synchronous mode) weekly from October 2025 to May 2026.

A **transdisciplinary learning** approach with **6 course modules**: Overarching Principles, Toxicology and Pharmacology, Pharmacogenomics, Pharmacoepidemiology, Methodology, and Machine Learning.

A **flexible training program with archived courses** allowing people registered on CAMCCO-L to access the **material and recordings of all courses** in which they are registered.

A **unique exchange environment** between trainees, CAMCCO-L alumni and mentors through its **discussion forum**, **journal clubs**, **webinars**, **and mentoring platform**.

A mother-child training program for the next generation of Canadian scientists offering vast and varied opportunities for networking, international internships, and in-person activities.

A **team of world-renowned researchers and mentors** from 11 Canadian universities in 7 provinces.

Trainees who complete the 1-year curriculum will obtain a certificate of completion from CAMCCO-L and the Maternal Infant Child and Youth Research Network (MICYRN).

1-Year CAMCCO-L Curriculum

Trainees enrolled in the 1-year curriculum commit to:

- Registering for all courses in the Overarching Principles Module
- Registering for all courses of at least 2 other course modules complementary to their university training field
- Attending all courses (synchronous) in the Overarching Principles Module and in the 2 complementary course modules selected
- Presenting an online journal club
- Presenting their research findings in person at the CAMCCO-L Annual Conference*
- Completing the self-evaluation e-portfolio
- Being matched with a mentor as part of the CAMCCO-L Mentorship Program
- Mentioning CAMCCO-L in presentations and publications of their research findings
- Becoming a CAMCCO-L alumni after completing the 1-year curriculum
- * Trainees enrolled in the curriculum will receive a travel bursary to attend the Annual Conference (and for the optional Summer School).



Eligibility Criteria

To join the 2025-2026 cohort of the 1-year curriculum, you must:

Be enrolled in a **Canadian university in a graduate academic program** (MSc, PhD) or as a **postdoctoral fellow**, **OR** be an **early career researcher** (PhD, MSc or MD obtained less than 5 years ago)

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Conduct therapeutic research in one of the following research areas:

- Maternal, fetal and/or infant health (perinatal health)
- Developmental or fetal toxicity (teratology)
- Maternal-fetal or obstetric medicine

Why Join the CAMCCO-L 1-Year Curriculum Cohort?

- To have the opportunity to apply for one of the five CAMCCO-L student bursaries
- To have the opportunity to receive a bursary for a research internship in collaboration with Mitacs
- To have front row seats to the latest scientific developments in the field of perinatal toxicology, pharmacogenomics, pharmacoepidemiology, methodology and machine learning
- To deepen your transdisciplinary knowledge and expertise in perinatal research on medications and expand your career opportunities
- To acquire state-of-the art methodology skills to identify risks and benefits of medication use

CAMCCO-L Bursaries

- 1) \$8,000 (CAD) to a master's student
- 2) \$10,000 (CAD) to a doctoral student
- 3) \$20,000 (CAD) to a postdoctoral fellow
- **4)** \$8,000 to \$20,000 (CAD), depending on the academic degree, to a visible or ethnic minority student
- **5)** \$8,000 to \$20,000 (CAD), depending on the academic degree, to a student member of Canada's Indigenous Peoples

Bursaries must be supplemented by a contribution from the research director of a minimum amount equivalent to the CAMCCO-L bursary.

CAMCCO-L bursaries cannot be cumulated with other peer-reviewed bursaries (e.g., CIHR, FRQ-S, etc.) whose duration of award overlaps in whole or in part with the CAMCCO-L curriculum (September to June).

Evaluation Criteria (Bursary Applications)

- Relevance of the research project in a therapeutic area with respect to: maternal, fetal and/or infant health (perinatal health); developmental or fetal toxicity (teratology); or maternal-fetal/obstetric medicine; and to toxicology/pharmacology, pharmacogenomics, pharmacoepidemiology, methodology/statistics or machine learning (30%)
- Academic excellence (20%)
- Relevant experience in research on medications (20%)
- Motivation letter (20%)
- Support letter and commitment for the bursary supplement from the research director (10%)

Apply in English or French **no later than May 9, 2025 at 16:00 EDT** by following the instructions below.

 - Your CV (max. 2 pages)
 - A motivation letter (max. 1 page) in which we invite you to discuss the following items:
 - The impact this bursary and/or CAMCCO-L training will have on you and your research
 - How your background demonstrates your resilience and your ability to work with expertises that are different from yours
 - An abstract describing your research field and project (max. 1 page)
 - A support letter from your research director (including the commitment for the bursary supplement) (max. 1 page)
 - Your transcript (statement) of grades

The selection of bursary recipients will be announced in June 2025.

The CAMCCO-L program subscribes to equity, diversity and inclusion principles. Indigenous peoples, racialized people, members of visible and ethnic minority groups as well as people with disabilities and LGBTQ2S+ people are strongly encouraged to apply.
